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
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

LEFT RIGHT GOBBLE




Preparation: Print out the turkey circles below and cut out. Optional: Print on one inch sticker paper and put on 1" wooden coins. Make the dice on the following page. You will need three dice.

How to Play: Give each person playing three turkey circles. Player one rolls the three dice. Do the following with the turkey circles based on what you roll: L - give one turkey to the player on your left, R - give one turkey to the player on your right, C - put one turkey in the middle and Turkey - keep the turkey. Pass the dice to the next player.

Only roll the number of dice equal to the number of turkey circles that you have on your turn. For example, if you have one turkey circle only roll on die.


The game is over when all the turkey circles are in the middle except one. The player with the one remaining turkey circle is the winner!





DICE FOR LEFT RIGHT GOBBLE

FOR SMALLER DICE: Print and glue each square onto 16 mm dice to create 3 dice.









FOR LARGER DICE: Print three of the templates below, cut out and glue sides to create three dice.






Thanks-GIVE-ing

Directions: Give each player a blank piece of paper. Cut up the sentence strips below. Put in a paper bag. Each player pulls out one sentence strip and illustrates the sentence at the top of the blank paper for 30 seconds. Fold your sentence strip up so no one can see it. Be sure to write the number of your sentence strip at the top of the paper.


Pass your illustration to the person on your right. This person now writes a sentence to put a caption on your picture. Fold the paper over so that you can no longer see the first illustration. Pass the paper again to your right. This player has to draw a illustration for the caption.

Continue playing until all players have had a turn with each piece of paper. Read out loud and show the progression of pictures for each original sentence strip.

- 10. Pumpkins, flowers and hay decorated the front porch.



TURKEY MYSTERY WORD HUNT DIRECTIONS

ONLY READ IF YOU ARE NOT PLAYING

Directions:

- 1. Divide up into teams. Print one set of mystery word hunt cards for each team playing. Cut apart the cards. Mark the back of the cards with the team number. For example, if there are 3 teams playing, write a number 1 on the back of the 12 cards, a number 2 on the back of another set of 12 cards and finally a number 3 on the back of another set of cards. Therefore you should have 36 cards total so that each team has a complete set of letter cards to find.
- 2. One person hides all the cards. Hide a letter card for each team in the same location. For example, if three teams are playing hide 3 letter 'T' cards on the couch.
- 3. Explain to the team that they have to find 12 different letter cards all with their team number on the back. When they find all 12 cards for their team return to the starting point.
- 4. When they return with all 12 cards, they have to unscramble the letters to form 2 words. The first team to find all 12 cards and unscramble the words in the winning team!
- 5. Depending upon the age of the players, the teams may need a clue. You can print the next page to provide a clue regarding the mystery words.
- 6. Read the solution at the bottom of the page.
