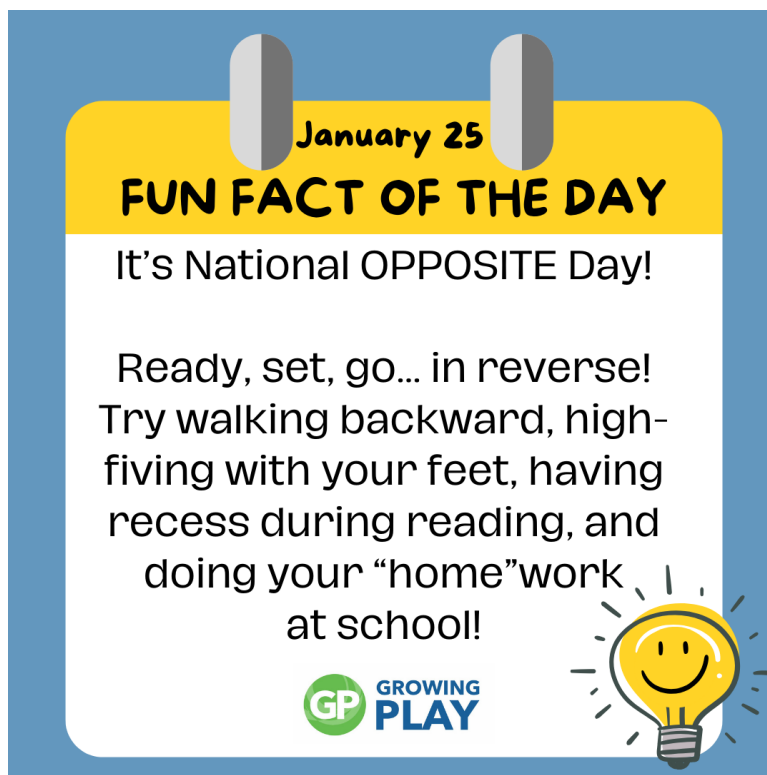


# January 25 Fact of the Day for Kids
